2021 IB Exam Amendments: Changes have been made to the IB exams. In some cases papers were reduced, in others questions were reduced, and in environmental systems and math no changes were made. Teachers are aware of these changes and will be making adjustments as they see fit. I have attached a PDF of the adjustments in the email.

More information about IB exam registration will be coming soon. This includes 504 / IEP accommodations for testing that will need to be sent to IB for approval, as well as, registration and payment for the exams. Financial assistance forms will be available.
